New Skills Center ~ for furnishings and equipment

■ One of the highest priority needs for the college is to replace a 1920s-era dilapidated building currently used for adult basic education and English as a second language (ESL) instruction. The new facility will be state-of-the-art offering training and education to businesses and students in a business skills computer lab as well as classes for older adults, ESL students, and those seeking basic education courses.
